MOTIVATION

2. SLIDE – VINCENT SHEET MUSIC

Do you like to listen to music? Do you listen to the lyrics? What are lyrics? (WORDS TO THE SONG) Sometimes lyrics tell a story. Today you will hear a song about a famous artist, Vincentyan Gogh, who lived over 100 years ago. After you've heard all about our artist's life and viewed his artwork, the lyrics will make sense to you, and you will understand what the song's composer is telling you about Vincent's life and art.

You will hear several important lyrics from the song that apply to works of art you will be seeing. Let's begin our discovery of van Gogh by looking at one of the many self-portraits by Vincent.

DEVELOPMENT

3. SLIDE – SELF-PORTRAIT

What was van Gogh feeling when he painted this SELF-PORTRAIT? (WORRIED, SAD, DEPRESSED, TIRED) Does Vincent look like an older man here? (YES) Even though all those line in his face look like wrinkles and make him look older, he was in his 30's and too young to have those

wrinkles.

4. SLIDE - CLOSE-UP: SELF-PORTRAIT

Van Gogh was interested in how we saw color, so he showed all his BRUSHSTROKES a colors, without smoothing them out like other artists of the time.

The lyrics of the song include van Gogh's most famous painting, Starry Night. Let's take look at Vincent's favorite painting.

5. SLIDE - THE STARRY NIGHT

What word best describes this painting, peaceful or exploding? (EXPLODING) When y normally think of a starlit night, would you visualize it like this? (NO) Neither would I. You will be this line in the lyrics of the song, "How you suffered for your sanity." What does that phrase mea (TROUBLED, CONFUSED, MEDICAL PROBLEMS)

Van Gogh painted this while he was in a hospital. Some historians believe he suffer throughout his life from a disease that was a rare form of epilepsy. This illness made it very diffic for him to get along with others. His behavior made others think he was strange. He wou periodically fly into uncontrollable rages against himself and others.

6. SLIDE – CLOSE-UP: STARRY NIGHT

As he looked out of his hospital window at the stars, he painted what he felt with wild swirling brush strokes. Look closely at the direction of the swirls. Another word for these swirls SPIRAL. A spiral is like a circle that keeps on going around and around. Some swirl to the right some swirl upwards. This way the lines balance each other, and keep our eyes in the center of the picture, instead of swirling off the canvas. Perhaps Vincent was also feeling like he was being pulle in all directions. He wanted so desperately to be a successful, self-supporting artist with a circle artist friends. But in reality he was all alone in a hospital, confused about what was wrong with hir unable to sell any of his paintings, and without a single friend to visit him and give him hope.

No artist before van Gogh had shown the force of a starry night. He saw the stars as a scienti would. He saw great suns whirling in space, not a peaceful scene at all. The next time you look at

starry night, try to think of it as van Gogh did.

7. SLIDE – HOSPITAL IN ARLES

Van Gogh painted many pictures while he was in the hospital. Since he didn't have models friends there to sit for portraits, he painted himself. He painted many lonely scenes of the hospit grounds, the hallways, and the fields around the buildings. Most of the paintings and their colo reflect how van Gogh was feeling at that time.

Do you get frustrated when you try to draw something for the first time, and it just doesn't loc right?

8. SLIDE – SKETCHES OF HANDS

Van Gogh and other famous artists have had that same problem! Even a very talented artidoesn't usually just sit down and complete a masterpiece on his first try.

Here are some sketches by van Gogh when he was preparing to paint figures of people. H studied them and sketched them for one whole winter. Can you tell me what kinds of hands these are Are they hands of royalty? (NO, HANDS OF WORKERS) Next you will see the finished painting for which he sketched all of those hands.

9. SLIDE – POTATO EATERS

Do you think he sketched and studied more than just hands for this painting? (YES) The title of this painting is *Potato Eaters*. What kind of life do you think these people led? (PEASANTS FARMERS, POOR, HARD-WORKING) Yes, van Gogh painted this to show the hard life of peasant farmer in Holland, where van Gogh was born. He wanted to show that the hands of these people eating potatoes were the same hands that dug up the potatoes in the fields.

What colors did he use to paint this? (EARTHTONES OF BROWNS, DARK COLORS HIGHLIGHTS OF YELLOW, BLUE) If he had used all bright colors, would the feeling be the same (NO) As we investigate more of van Gogh's paintings, you will see that he used color to express how he felt about the subject he was painting. He expressed emotions through color.

10. SLIDE – CLOSE-UP: POTATO EATERS

Look closely at the faces of the people. Do they look like they are carved out of wood? (YES Van Gogh used this technique to show what a rough, rugged life they led.

Before van Gogh became an artist, he trained to become a minister. He traveled around hi

native Holland ministering to peasants who led very hard lives. But he was shy and found it hard to alk in front of people, so after a short while, he regretfully gave up this work. That's when he decide to devote all his time to art.

11. SLIDE – SELF-PORTRAIT PAUL GAUGUIN/YELLOW HOUSE IN ARLES Do you have a friend named Paul? Vincent met a fellow artist he admired very much. Hi

name was Paul Gauguin (go-GAN). When Vincent lived in the south of France he invited Paul to visit and stay with him. When Gauguin accepted the invitation, Van Gogh was so excited to have another artist to paint with, he did something special to get his cottage ready. What do you think he did ANSWERS WILL VARY) Before company arrives, some people clean house and might even but lowers to decorate a table. But van Gogh painted flowers instead. He painted several canvases of one of his favorite flowers that just happened to be growing in a field near his cottage. They come in his

avorite color of yellow. Can you guess what flower that is?

If you guessed sunflowers, you're correct. Notice the unusual place where Vincent signed his name...right on the vase. Most artists sign their names in the corners, but Vincent chose a more prominent place. To make sure you notice the vase, what did he do to it? (OUTLINED IT WITH CHICK RED LINE) When Paul Gauguin came to stay, he complimented van Gogh on these flower paintings, but that was probably the last nice comment he made. Sad and lonely van Gogh needed arriend more than anything, especially one who also enjoyed painting. But, unfortunately, his friend was

ossy and self-centered. He would constantly criticize van Gogh's paintings, and that led to frequen

rguments. Van Gogh painted something of Gauguin's. Can you guess what it might be?

4. SLIDE - GAUGUIN'S ARMCHAIR/VAN GOGH'S ARMCHAIR

ecause they weren't communicating with each other.

Did you guess he chose a chair to paint?! Which one is Gauguin's? (WITH CANDLE) Doesn't seem like Gauguin should be seated in it? Twice van Gogh painted an empty chair, first Gauguin's not then his own. Does it give you the feeling of loneliness to see an empty chair? (YES) The two nen were arguing constantly when Vincent painted this. It shows how lonely and unhappy he felt

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Another important lyric from the song is: "They would not listen, they did not know how." Very Gogh felt his friend wasn't listening to him, and he felt lonely when he painted Gauguin's chair. We time of day does the picture show? (NIGHT CANDLES LIT) What clues tell you Gauguin is near or has recently left? (BOOKS LEFT ON SEAT OF CHAIR, CANDLE BURNING)

Van Gogh and Gauguin continued to argue constantly. Their violent disagreements finally to a tragedy. Van Gogh tried twice to attack Gauguin. Gauguin was able to escape, but to pun himself for his attack against his friend, van Gogh cut off part of his own ear.

15. SLIDE – SELF-PORTRAIT WITH BANDAGED EAR

(YES) What words would describe how van Gogh was feeling? (UNHAPPY, DEPRESSE NERVOUS, TIRED) Notice the colors he chose. Do the colors blend together and make you fee calm? (NO) Do the colors contrast and help set the mood of tension and unhappiness? (YES) List again to a lyric from the song, *Vincent*, "weathered faces lined in pain, soothed beneath the artist loving hand." Could those words refer to this portrait? (YES, POSSIBLY)

16. SLIDE – PEACH TREES IN BLOOM

I want you to look closely at the TEXTURE in this painting, titled *Peach Trees in Bloot*. Texture is how something feels when you touch it. Van Gogh painted a lot of texture into his painting for us to see. He didn't carefully blend his paint into the canvas. He left it thick to create texture, we could feel it with our eyes.

We're going to pretend we're in a museum featuring the work of van Gogh. We enter a roo and our eyes are immediately drawn to this painting. We want to discover how he created all the texture, so we walk right up for a close up view. Keep your eye on the right-hand side of the painting about in the middle where the fence is.

17. SLIDE – CLOSE UP: PEACH TREES

Now we can really see the texture and the colors! Doesn't it look different? That's why it's great to see original paintings in museums, because they look so different and beautiful up close. He did van Gogh create so much texture in this painting? (BRUSHSTROKES, THICK PAINT, COLO LINES) Looking this closely we clearly see his techniques.

Look at how he used thick white paint to show the soft white flowers. He often applied thi paint to the canvas with a palette knife instead of a brush. Many museums around the world prote their van Gogh paintings by covering them with glass, so the paint won't chip off. Listen to this line from the song *Vincent* and try to figure out what it means, "portraits hung empty halls, frameless heads on nameless walls." Can anyone interpret that lyric? (NOBODY LIKE OR BOUGHT HIS PAINTINGS) Van Gogh painted over 1700 works of art in his last ten years. I worked feverishly, and many times would not stop to eat or sleep until he had finished a painting. I would then collapse from exhaustion. He sold only one painting during his lifetime.

18. SLIDE - THE RED VINEYARD

This is the only painting he ever sold for about \$80. The sister of a German artist purchased These are farm workers picking grapes in the field. What colors jump out at you? (RED, YELLOV ORANGE) These are the colors of autumn when these grapes were harvested. Are they WARM

19. SLIDE – WARM/COOL COLORS

Most of us notice WARM COLORS like red, yellow, orange first in a painting. They are exciting an dramatic. The COOL COLORS of blue, green and purple are calm, peaceful colors.

20. SLIDE - PORTRAIT OF DR. GACHET (GA-SHAY)

It was only after he died that van Gogh's work became popular. In fact, his paintings now see for millions of dollars. You are now looking at one of the most expensive paintings that has ever been sold. In 1990, a wealthy Japanese businessman purchased this painting at an auction in New York Ci

for almost \$90 million. That's 90 with six zeros after it.

Look at this painting of van Gogh's doctor and friend and interpret the lyrics, "weathered face lined in pain, soothed beneath the artist's loving hand." Raise your hand if those words seem to fit th portrait, also. (YES) What do the colors express in this painting? (SADNESS-TONES OF BLUI Gachet was also an artist, and also suffered from mental problems. How does van Gogh show this

the painting? (WORRIED, EMPTY LOOK IN EYES, USE OF TONES OF BLUE, RESTING O

ELBOW AS IF TIRED OF LIFE) Let's compare Vincent's Portrait of Dr. Gachet with a photograph of his friend.

21. SLIDE - PHOTO OF DR. GACHET

Raise your hand if you see a similarity between the portrait and the photo. (YES) What is the

same? (DROOPY EYES AND MOUTH, SHAPE OF FACE AND FEATURES) What is different (POSE, CHIN, ETC.) Van Gogh never felt much love or acceptance from the people around him, except for a lovin brother, Theo (Tay-o).

22. SLIDE – WHEATFIELD WITH CROWS

Finally, one day, while in a field where he frequently painted, he died at the young age of thirty-seven. Van Gogh was in a small village outside of Paris on a starry, starry night when he died.

CONCLUSION

23. SLIDE – SELF-PORTRAIT AT EASEL/VOCABULARY

Now that you know about Vincent van Gogh's troubled life and have seen his paintings, I wi play the entire song of, "Vincent" and all the lyrics will have more meaning for you.

PLAY MUSIC - "Vincent" by Don McLean

Show all slides while playing music, stopping with self-portrait. (PowerPoint program Click on music bell icon on the MEET THE MASTERS logo slide. Music will play through repeat of all images that follow logo slide.)

LYRICS: "Starry, starry night. Paint your palette blue and gray. Look out on a summer's day wit eyes that know the darkness in my soul. Shadows on the hills. Sketch the trees and the daffodils

Catch the breeze and the winter chills in colors on the snowy, linen land. Now I understand what yo ried to say to me. How you suffered for your sanity. And how you tried to set them free. They would not listen, they did not know how. Perhaps they'll listen now

Starry, starry night. Flaming flowers that brightly blaze. Swirling clouds in violet haz reflecting Vincent's eyes of china blue. Colors changing hue. Morning fields of amber grain Weathered faces lined in pain are soothed beneath the artist's loving hand. Now I understand what

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you tried to say to me and how you suffered for your sanity and how you tried to set them free. The would not listen, they did not know how. Perhaps they never will.

For they could not love you. But still your love was true. And when no hope was left inside of that starry, starry night, you took your life as lovers often do. But I could have told you, Vincent, the world was never meant for one as beautiful as you.

Starry, starry night. Portraits hung in empty halls, frameless heads on nameless walls with eyes that watch the world and can't forget. Like the strangers that you've met. The ragged men is ragged clothes, the silver thorn of a bloody rose, lie crushed and broken on the virgin soil.

Now I think I know what you tried to say to me. How you suffered for your sanity. And ho you tried to set them free. They would not listen. They're not listening still. Perhaps they never will.
